UAF Yup'ik Course Offerings: Spring 2023

*All courses are offered via distance learning, and are NOT in-person

Conversational Central Yup'ik I (YUP 103): Entry-level course to learn to speak and understand Yup'ik Eskimo. Focus on communication in everyday situations. Kuskokwim and Northwest campuses only.

Beginning Yup'ik Grammar (YUP 130): Literacy and grammatical analysis of Central Yup'ik language for language learners. Students will learn basic grammatical concepts and literacy skills, with consideration given to dialect differences.(**Prerequisites:** <u>YUP F103</u> or <u>YUP F122</u> or basic conversational Yup'ik skills.) *Taught by Dr. Sally Samson, located in Bethel.*

**Offered: Monday and Wednesday 7:20-8:50pm

Conversational Central Yup'ik IV (YUP 204): Continuation of <u>YUP F203</u>. Development of proficiency in the Central Yup'ik language, vocabulary for everyday situations, reading and writing. *Taught by Dr. Sally Samson, located in Bethel.*

**Offered: Tuesday and Thursday 6:50-8:20pm

Yup'ik Composition (YUP 208): An examination of the development of written Yup'ik and exploration of writing where Yup'ik is the dominant language. New writing styles are examined, rather than simply translating the standard categories of English composition. Students receive extensive practice in Yup'ik orthography and participate in the evaluation of each other's writings. *Taught by Dr. Sally Samson, located in Bethel.* (**Prerequisites:** <u>YUP F109.</u>)
